**Dear Friends in Christ,**

Today's feast of the Baptism of the Lord concludes the Christmas Season, and tomorrow we enter into "Ordinary Time." The church's use of the word "ordinary" is not in the sense of "common" but rather is taken from the word "**ordinal**" which means "**numbered**." The Church does not let a day go by without counting it as belonging to God, so this Monday will be "Monday in the first week of Ordinary Time." Liturgical time is the way we measure our lives, recognizing that every moment belongs to God. The Sundays of Ordinary Time are counted between the end of the Christmas Season and the beginning of the Lenten Season and then from the end of the Easter Season (after Pentecost) to the Sunday before Advent, which is the Solemnity of Christ the King toward the end of November. There are 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary Time, and the Scripture readings on these Sundays help us explore the many different aspects of the paschal mystery of Christ. Advent-Christmas and Lent-Easter are more expansive celebrations of particular aspects of the one paschal mystery of Christ which we celebrate every Sunday—the life, death, resurrection, and ascension of our Lord.

**The center of the liturgical year is the Easter Triduum**, beginning on Holy Thursday evening (April 1<sup>st</sup> this year) and stretching through Easter Sunday evening, April 4<sup>th</sup>. The Season of Lent, from Ash Wednesday, February 17 – Thursday afternoon, April 1<sup>st</sup> prepares us for this high point of the year. The 50 days of the Easter Season flow like a river of joy from the Triduum, concluding with Pentecost on May 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Today is "**Commitment Sunday**" as the members of our parish recommit to sharing this year the gifts of their time, talent and treasure in service of the Kingdom of God. Completed Stewardship forms can be mailed or dropped off at the parish office, or placed in the Sunday collection.

I will be leaving this Friday for San Jose, California, to visit Fr. Kevin Joyce and vacation with him for one week, returning here the evening of January 22<sup>nd</sup>.
