Dear Friends in Christ,

Beginning at the 10 a.m. Mass this Sunday, and for the following two Sundays, our elect (those catechumens chosen for the Easter sacraments of baptism, confirmation and eucharist) will be celebrating the **scrutinies**. The scrutinies are celebrated every Lent on the 3rd-5th Sundays as a **way to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful** in the hearts of the elect, and **also to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good**. The scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life. The scrutinies are meant to complete the conversion of the elect to Christ. Although we who are baptized do not celebrate the scrutinies, we not only pray for the elect during these special rituals but also to ask God to reveal to us during this Lenten Season the sinful attitudes that hold us in bondage, to set us free from those sins, and to strengthen all that is upright and good in us.

Tonight (Sunday night) from 6:45 – 8:15 p.m. in the church, I will present a **“Teaching Mass”** for our Confirmation students, and anyone is welcome to attend. I will walk through the Mass, from beginning to end, explaining why we do what we do and why we use the sacred objects that we use.

The Rice Bowls are available on the countertop in the gathering area. They were delivered late because of the major winter storms that crippled travel on the East Coast. You can make the final weeks of Lent a sacred time of focused prayer, fasting, and almsgiving through the use of the Rice Bowl by having one simple meal per week, giving away the money saved on that meal to Catholic Relief Services on Holy Thursday, and using the suggested prayers for people in the world who are hungry.

Donations made using the blue March 14th “Minority Groups” envelopes are used by the Black and Indian Mission Office to support pastoral ministry, Catholic schools and religious education programs in impoverished areas. Last year 132 dioceses were helped by this appeal, including our own archdiocese

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast and abstinence are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

Catholic Bishops Urge Participation in 2010 Census

Through the Secretariat of Cultural Diversity in the Church, the US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) is partnering with the US Census Bureau to encourage participation in the Census 2010, in order to reach hard-to-count communities. Archbishop Jose Gomez, chairman of the USCCB Committee on Cultural Diversity, urges parishes and dioceses to encourage local people to participate and states, "Pastors have a responsibility to know their flock ...
