**Dear Friends in Christ,**

The hailstorm that struck our parish last Sunday caused quite a bit of damage. It destroyed the 3 skylights in the gathering area of the church as well as one skylight in the school atrium and damaged 2 others there. It damaged a number of our A.C. units and damaged the roofs of all our buildings, including the Laughlin House, our new rent house on Greystone, and the rectory. We also had some water problems in the rooms on the north side of our parish plant, which took the brunt of the storm (Pre-K rooms and one of the meeting rooms). The landscaping that had been completed a few weeks ago with new flowers was wiped out and the trees shorn of many of their leaves. As I write this letter, the insurance adjustor has yet to visit our parish, so there is no exact estimate on the damage. However, there will be a \$2500 deductible to pay before the insurance coverage begins. We owe a big debt of **thanks to Jim Abernathy, chair of our Building and Grounds Committee,** who is spearheading the repairs to our buildings.

This past Tuesday a number of our high school seniors graduated from Bishop McGuinness Catholic High School, and one of them, **Nick Aguilera was honored as valedictorian.** Congratulations Nick!

There will be no Mass here on Memorial Day, May 31<sup>st</sup>. However, **Archbishop Beltran will offer 2 Masses on Memorial Day at Resurrection Cemetery** (next to the Catholic Pastoral Center on N.W. Expressway) *at 8 a.m. and 11 a.m.*

The search has officially begun for a permanent Coordinator of Youth and Young Adult Ministry. Last year Cristina Vizcaino was hired as Interim Coordinator, and she is applying for the permanent position, along with other candidates. **Robyn Duginski is chairing this Search Committee,** along with Parish Staff members, **Gloria Pantazis and Judi Wilkinson.** The other members of the committee are **Joe Fleckinger, Imelda Aleman, Lori Canfield, and Jan Latta.**
